

ABSTRACT SUBMISSION TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Warranties by Submitter

1. By submitting an abstract intended for presentation at the Congress, the submitter warrants that all material in the abstract(s) **will not** have been previously published in any publication or publicly presented at any meeting(s) or event(s) of any other scientific organisation before the World Congress of Dermatology 2027 and that it does not contain any unlawful or libellous material or material that infringes upon the intellectual property rights of any other third party, including rights to enforce confidentiality obligations.
2. The submitter warrants having full power, authority, and capacity to submit the abstract and to agree to these terms and conditions. Where the abstract has been prepared by more than one author, the submitter warrants having informed all co-authors and obtained their express consent to its submission in accordance with these terms and conditions.

Consent to Publication and Assignment of Copyright

3. Abstracts accepted will be published in the exact form submitted. Submitters must therefore ensure that all information provided is correct and accurate. Submitted abstracts may be modified until the submission deadline by editing and saving the updated version within the WCD2027 Abstract Platform. After the submission deadline, authors wishing to withdraw their abstract must send a written request to: wcd2027abstract@thetriumph.com.
4. By submitting an abstract, the submitter expressly agrees to the following:
 - a. The submitter warrants being the author of the original material contained in the abstract and further warrants that the proprietor of all copyright in the abstract (which, in certain cases, may not be the submitter or author but the author's employer) and/or any co-authors of the abstract agree to all the terms of the Abstract Submission Regulations, including all terms relating to the assignment of copyright set out below.
 - b. In consideration of the Congress accepting the abstract for publication and the professional benefits arising from such publication, the submitter (including any co-authors) and/or the proprietor of all rights in copyright pertaining to the abstract agree to the assignment of all



rights in copyright in relation to the abstract to the International League of Dermatological Societies (ILDS), including but not limited to:

- I. The right to publish the abstract in print, electronic form or any other medium;
 - II. The right to grant permission to third parties to re-publish the abstract, as deemed appropriate and at its discretion;
 - III. The right to re-publish the abstract in a collection of abstracts in any format, including print and electronic media. For the avoidance of doubt, “electronic and digital forms” shall include, but shall not be limited to, databases, USB devices, and formats accessible via electronic and digital networks, wireless transmission and communication systems.
- c. Notwithstanding the above, the author(s) of the abstract shall retain the moral rights of authorship and the right to the integrity of the work contained in the abstract.

Use of Information

5. The submitter agrees that the Congress and the ILDS may process the submitter’s personal data (name, surname, country, email address), including storing or transferring such data outside the submitter’s country of residence, in order to process transactions related to the publication and/or presentation of the abstract.
6. By submitting an abstract, the submitter confirms that permission has been obtained from all other contributors or authors of the abstract for the processing of their personal data in accordance with these terms and conditions.

Confidentiality of Abstract(s)

7. Abstracts submitted to the Congress are considered confidential until publicly presented and/or published in connection with the Congress. Prior to such presentation or publication, the author(s), research sponsors, or proprietors of the copyright in the abstract(s) may not make the information public or use it for trading purposes without obtaining prior written permission from the Congress.



Embargoed materials include—but are not limited to—original journal articles, abstracts from scientific meetings, written news releases, audio or video news releases, interviews, slides, and any other materials associated with the scientific information being presented or published.

The embargo automatically lifts at **07:00 GMT-6 on 21 June 2027**, unless otherwise extended or modified by the ILDS. Consequently, submitted abstracts are considered embargoed from the time of submission until **07:00 GMT-6 on 21 June 2027**, the first day of the Congress.

8. Following the conclusion of the World Congress of Dermatology 2027 and the lifting of the embargo described above, any request for reproduction, republication, distribution or other use of one or more abstracts—whether in print, electronic or any other form—must be submitted in writing to the International League of Dermatological Societies (ILDS) for prior authorisation. The ILDS, as the copyright holder, reserves the right to grant or deny such authorisation at its sole discretion and may require appropriate citation or acknowledgement of the original publication.
